Sports Premium is a specific allocation of funds, additional to main school funding which the government believes is the best way to improve provision of physical education and sport in schools.

Vision: All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objectives:

- 1) To provide high-quality PE and sport in Primary School.
- 2) To inspire pupils and create future sporting pathways.
- 3) Ensure children have knowledge, skills and motivation to lead a healthy lifestyle.

Key outcome indicators:

- 1) The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- 2) Broad experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 3) Increased participation in competitive sport.

After school clubs are going from strength to strength will growing numbers all the time. Children are engaged and excited to take part in the after school activities. Children took part in a wide range of competitive and non-competitive events and competitions from a range of year groups. The school hosted a friendly football tournament for local primary schools to promote team sport and participation which all KS2 children (girls and boys) took part in. Sports events in and out of school are always well supported by parents e.g. mini Viking Challenge, Sports day etc. A growing number of children attend the Cross Country events on a Saturday morning to represent the school.
